Our very own Tory Cook spent a rare child-free weekend in London with her husband, staying at the luxurious Sanderson on Berners Street.

With three children under the age of 10, a weekend away is a rare treat so my husband and I were thrilled to have the opportunity to stay at Sanderson, a beautiful hotel just off Oxford Street in London.

We booked a two night stay and arrived on the Friday evening to be welcomed by a smartly dressed doorman who showed us in to the reception area... and what an area it is! Lots of floaty curtains line the windows and walls, a large red sofa in the shape of a pair of lips entices you to have a perch while you check-in and a cello case lures you to a photo opportunity!

We took the lift, with its mirrored doors on the outside and a lit up solar system on the inside, up to our room. A cool, calm, relaxing space awaited us with crisp white bed linen on an enormous bed. The bathroom was separated by a glass wall, with discretionary curtains electronically operated. All immaculately presented and with no detail left undone; plenty of storage space, fluffy towels and fabulous toiletries together with a well-stocked mini-bar and emergency provisions. A huge mirror added to the glamour of the room and reflected the light and space perfectly.

On the ground floor, just off the reception area is The Long Bar with doors out to a beautiful, secluded outdoor area with water features and comfortable seating. An impressive cocktail menu is available and the bar was buzzing all evening, a great way to relax and unwind after a busy week! It is also a great place to start off for an evening out in London where you are a stone's throw away from the



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West End theatres, China Town, Soho, Leicester Square and a plethora of excellent restaurants, bars and clubs. We made the most of our time and hit China Town for dinner and a late night film in Leicester Square – for those of you with children, you will understand why a cinema visit is a luxury!

We strolled back to the wonderful Sanderson through Soho and welcomed the cool, calm interior once we got there.

Breakfast is served on the ground floor overlooking the garden and the selection was perfect; guests can choose from a buffet of fruit, cereal, pastries, cold meats and cheese to



a good old English fry-up! Washed down with plenty of tea, coffee or fresh juices, we were set up for a day of visiting old haunts and some new ones too!
